# WAKE-UP CALL

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#### INTRODUCTION

The Virtual Biennale Prague has been held in the Czech Republic since 2007. Each of these international artistic assemblies is based on a specific theme. This year sees the biennale's 11th edition. The current biennale's topic is Wake-Up Call. This is also the title of an exhibition at the 3D Blue Point Art Gallery (at the Polish University Abroad (PUNO) in London¹) which follows the publication. The exhibition is one of several international poster exhibitions within the framework of events promoting results of the competition in 2020².

The initiators of the Virtual Biennale Prague – involving poster designers in two categories: one for professionals and another for students – are prof. Karel Míšek and dr. Lenka Sýkorová. Both of them are associated with the Jan Evangelista Purkyně University in Ústí nad Labem in the Czech Republic<sup>3</sup>.

Profesor Míšek is a graphic designer, typographer and the author of unique posters. As a former student of the "father" of the Polish

Poster School, Henryk Tomaszewski – Míšek is also the heir to the ideas promoted by the school. Its characteristic feature was to combine painting aesthetics with a metaphor of a sparing message applied in the poster. The results of those activities highlight the artfulness of a poster and their suggestive content, often containing references to various cultural threads<sup>4</sup>.

Doctor Sýkorová is an art historian, critic and curator of contemporary fine art (i.e. Altán Klamovka Gallery in Prague). Her research and curatorial activities coincide in creativity. Sýkorová creates new artistic spaces by experimenting with exhibiting and understanding the image as a non-verbal message that can be read across cultures.

These unique duo, for years, have been gathering around their own initiatives an international group of experts in a field of arts and also visual artists themselves, either as members of the jury or participants in the competition.

Since the beginning, the idea of the competition was based on participants' involvement in social issues (including: discrimination, fake news, ect.).

Importantly, it has often referred to the global context as well as to finding its local resonance, indicating important elements of the given community or individuals life. The verbal and non-verbal communication conveyed by the black and white posters, the essence of Prague Biennale, provided an opportunity for a critical view of the contemporary world.

The 11th edition of the Prague's Biennale has coincided with the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic, gaining additional significance. How the topic of Wake-Up Call was interpreted by participants is confirmed by notes to the awarded posters. On one hand, we have references to the pandemic and reactions to the events related to Black Lives Matter movement in the United States. On the other hand, there is a more universal approach, concerning human beings as a part of a society, as well as a view of the present day from the perspective of a man entangled in media chaos.

What seems to be really piercing throughout all these works are the common desire to understand the world and desire to achieve harmony — the issues almost as old as the existence of human culture. Between the proposed ways of achieving these ambitions, artists point out, amongst others, openness to each other, the use of resistance to injustice that we encounter, the pursuit of freedom or quite simply being optimistic. Collected by the curator of the event on common denominator

Wake-up call these findings give asumpt to look at the surrounding problems from several perspectives. At the same time, they imply a sort of unanimity which is briefly outlined by the one message — one goal. According to Sýkorová, this is far-reaching, it can inspire people with something positive because "art has the potential to influence the future".

This publication consists of three main parts. In the first one, we can learn about the assumptions made by organisers of the Virtual Biennial Prague. In here Karel Míšek, Laze Tripkov and Lenka Sýkorová share their insights.

In the second part, we acquaint ourselves with the formal information about the 11th edition: Wake-Up Call (such as Organizing Committee, Jury, etc.) and final results of the competition. Subsequently, the awarded works are presented with the author's note, which specifies an artistic concept.

The third and last of the publication presents biograms of the Virtual Biennial Prague initiators, the members of jury and the artists awarded in 2020.

# **ABOUT**

## VIRTUAL BIENNALE PRAGUE PROJECT

#### Karel Míšek

Co-author the Virtual Biennale Prague

For a long time, I was contemplating on the idea of an alternative platform that would be as independent, attractive and accessible to many artists and views on globally interesting topics as possible. I knew that all established exhibitions had the same system of selecting and including artworks in catalogs and exhibitions. An enlightened approach to selecting exhibits is very important in this case. Nowadays, it takes a very long time to exhibit artworks, which also has an impact on the presented artworks. Nevertheless, something very positive came out of this fact. I had reached the conclusion that it was possible to create a new and inexpensive platform for topical and strong topics that could bring together artists based on their interest in the project content. I was very surprised – and not only me – by the interest of art students and professional artists in the first Virtual Biennale Prague. Speed and topicality were exactly the characteristics of today's social networks.

I asked the art historian Lenka Sýkorová and my colleagues to join the project since it could not have been done without them. We put together an international jury, which worked under internationally recognized conditions, and ensured printing and everything necessary to make the project possible. The name "Virtual Biennale Prague" was chosen on purpose as provocation, hyperbole in relation to established poster and graphic design exhibitions, even though our biennale was held every year. The fact that the artists sent their posters in black and white made everything faster, and it was very interesting to see the final result. The posters sent to the biennale competition were always exhibited in the Altán Klamovka Gallery in printed form as well as in a virtual gallery<sup>5</sup>.

Showing integrity toward visions and creative values, the designer, authorship and copyrights, ideas and leadership. As an organizer of poster competitions and other manifestations, the Virtual Biennale Prague community pays important attention to inter-ethnic collaboration, professional community development and local student and professional community engagement, creating a strong design value that is increasing its potential.

Bearing in mind the problems and progress that await us designers on the road to the future and by preserving the authenticity, and the cultural design outreach, Virtual Biennale Prague can inspire new values for generations to come.

## VIRTUAL BIENNALE PRAGUE: WAKE-UP CALL 2020

#### Lenka Sýkorová

Co-author and a Curator of the Virtual Biennale Prague

Covid-19 pandemic which resulted in social distancing has negatively impacted cultural activities that depend on visitors and their direct interaction.

After surviving the first hit of coronavirus, it is important to continue working in the art sector as it is essential for psychological well-being. One of the many cultural roles is to highlight the potential of art which will shape the future. At the same time, it is obvious how safe the virtual world could be without possibility of direct contact with another human being. This seems more hygienic, and it helps to minimize the spread of the disease. That's why the 11TH Virtual Biennale Prague project is more important than ever before.

The platform for an international poster exhibition called Virtual Biennale Prague was founded by AUG Design Association in 2007 in Prague<sup>7</sup>. Thanks to the internet, drawings have been seen as the tools of non-verbal communication across nations globally<sup>8</sup>.

The project based on non-verbal and intercultural communication is a good example of how to incorporate educational aspects into artistic practice through the confrontation and exhibition of artworks. Through integration of drawing with graphics and typography, graphic designing becomes a visual language that can be adressed by social issues. The international posters exhibition platform has already held several topics across the globe (Global Crisis, Discrimination, Corruption, Fake News, etc.). Current project is supported by the Department of Visual Communication of the Faculty of Art and Design at Jan Evangelista Purkyně University in Ústí nad Labem (prof. Karel Míšek and Jakub Konupka) and the Altán Klamovka Gallery in Prague (Lenka Sýkorová).

Out of all registered works on Wake-Up Call in 2020, the board selected 259 participants from 20 countries; 146 professionals, 113 students and 49 universities. The 11th Virtual Biennale Prague 2020 Wake-Up Call is taking place in both virtual and traditional ways. The virtual venues of this year's exhibition including the Tumblr – a social networking 'microblog' (https://wake-up-call-2020.tumblr.com)<sup>9</sup> and the 3D Blue Point Art

Gallery at the Polish University Abroad in London (PUNO), UK (https://clacu.puno.edu.pl/wake-up-call) is opening on 27th November<sup>10</sup>. A physical locations of the Wake-Up Call exhibition are at the Altán Klamovka Gallery in Prague – which opens on 1st December, and at the State Historical Museum of South Ural in Chelyabinsk in Russia as a part of the 6th Festival of Contemporary Art «Debarcader-2020» (3-17 November 2020).

This sustainable non-profit project is environment-friendly and it reduces regular costs on printing and travel. Based on D.I.Y. principles, it also eliminates the impact of large institutions and focuses on a new form of an artistic visual message that has no boundaries between nations. Posters are evaluated by professional graphic designers online and the project easily reaches people outside the EU (Mexico, China, the USA, etc.). Using a visual language, we are developing an exhibition that shows the impact of digital technologies and the ever-present Internet, which is a permanent and available visual material; however, behind these irreversible changes, it is possible to capture

the author's statement through drawing and typography as evidence of cultural legacy, national identity and diversity<sup>11</sup>.

We are entering a new time, a decade with the vision that our project will remain non-profit and independent. We are continually responding to current topics related to the global development of society. Our small organizational team and the international jury are staying focused on developing different possibilities of poster presentation in a virtual environment. We are also expanding collaboration and are supporting the projects of French designer Thierry Sarfis 2degrees; Chinese designer Li Xu Anti-Novel Coronavirus and Polish colleagues from the United Kingdom, Justyna Gorzkowicz and Jarosław Solecki Blue Point Art Gallery 3D platform.

As a curator, I realize that social problems cannot be resolved by the limited form of author posters, but in the way that art has been done since the 20th century<sup>12</sup>. I focus on the fact that it is possible to point out problems, which are part of the process of self-identification through art, the

case, where artwork is initiated by an artist himself or a curator. At the same time, I believe that art can cultivate visual culture which creates aesthetic values of society and a cultural heritage for future generations<sup>13</sup>.





#### Resistance







If we take a look at the events of this year, we can observe a massive lethargy in society, too much confidence in the mass media and slow thinking about real problems. This poster presents a visual metaphor for the need to wake up to the real world. The main motif of the poster is a pacifier, the soft part of it is replaced by a cactus plant. The primary purpose of the pacifier is to calm down a baby. A cactus is a plant that has no leaves, only thorns. If we change the familiar softness of the pacifier and replace it with the sharpness of a cactus, the pacifier will lose its original function. The connection between these two objects creates a visual situation that is striking and unpleasant to watch. The poster is made by expressive hand-drawing.

Nadia Ceruti (1988, Ivrea, Turin) – Grand Prix Wake-Up Call. She graduated with a degree in Graphic and Virtual Design from the Polytechnic University of Turin in 2012. That same year, she attended a 6-month extracurricular internship at Laboratorio Zanzara, a non-profit social cooperative that aids people with mental illness in the fields of art, design and graphics. She interned again for six months in Karlsruhe (DE) at Magma Brand Design, a communication agency where she worked on corporate identity projects and posters. Once back in Italy, she returned to Laboratorio Zanzara, fascinated by its peculiarity in being a breeding ground for experimentation where different sensibilities meet, artistically and on a human level. She has been working here since 2015, under the artistic direction of Gianluca Cannizzo, handling projects ranging from Illustration to exhibition and event planning, from brand identity to publishing and packaging.





**Prof. dr. hab. Lex Drewinski** (1951, Szczecin, Poland) – Professionals: Honourable Mention Wake-Up Call. Lex Drewinski was a student at the State Higher School of Fine Arts (now the University of Fine Arts) in Poznań in Poland from 1976 – 1981 (he graduated with honors from Professor Waldemar Świerzy's Class of Poster Art). In 1983 – 1985, Drewinski worked as a director and scriptwriter at the Animated Film Studio in Poznań.

In 1985, Prof. Lex Drewinski left Poland for West Berlin. From 1992 - 2017, he was a professor at the Faculty of Graphic Design at the University of Applied Sciences in Potsdam (Germany). In 2008, he was promoted to Doctor of Fine Arts (University of Fine Arts, Poznań). In 2011, he was habilitated to Doctor of Fine Arts (University of Fine Arts, Poznań). In 2015, he was appointed a professor of fine arts by the President of the Republic of Poland (University of Fine Arts, Poznań). Since 2010, he has been a professor of the Faculty of Graphic Design at the Academy of Art in Szczecin (Poland). From 2002 - 2016, he wrote columns for the Polish Design Quarterly "2+3D". Drewinski has won more than 200 awards and distinctions, mainly in international competitions and cyclical and occasional events. He has had one-man shows in more than 60 exhibitions all over the world. He is an honorary member of the Association of Applied Graphic Designers (STGU).





**Salomon Fabio** (22 years old) – Students: Honourable Mention Wake-Up Call. He is a graphic design student at IAAD Bologna in Italy. I have always been interested in light, especially in its interaction with different shapes and materials. In my works, I want to recreate realistic environments through the combination of vector shapes and artificial lights. My process starts with a meticulous analysis of an existing environment, and this allows me to notice every little aspect that creates our world and reality.

She studied Fashion Design and worked as a fashion and textile designer in her home country. After moving to Austria, she studied in Linz, from where she earned a Master of Arts in Visual Communication. After graduating, she worked for advertising companies in Vienna and Salzburg. Teija Hohl has decades of experience in teaching at various educational institutions. Currently, she is a senior lecturer at the University of Art and Design Linz (Kunstuniversität Linz). She also works as a product designer and freelance illustrator. Teija Hohl has participated in many poster exhibitions focusing mainly on social issues, in Austria and abroad. Her artwork is included in the permanent collections at many prominent museums around the world, such as the Victoria & Albert Museum in London (UK), the Dansk Plakatmuseum in Aarhus (Denmark) and the Center for the Study of Political Graphics, Culver City (USA).





**Jakub Konupka** (1987, Czech Republic) – a member of the Organising Committee and graphic designer of the Wake-Up Call. He studied under the lead of prof. Victor Kovalenko (1987, Odintsovo, Moscow region) – Professionals: Honourable Mention Wake-Up Call. He is a graphic designer from Russia Middlesex University London MA Graphic Design graduate with distinction. He has more than 10 years of experience in projects that involved editorial and poster design, books/catalogues design, typography, illustrations, photography, portrait graphics and the layout of various publications. He has been a participant, finalist, selected and invited designer in more than 70 international and national design exhibitions and competitions. His works have been presented in multiple exhibitions in 19 countries: the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, Spain, Hungary, Poland, Estonia, Slovakia, Turkey, Cyprus, Russia, Iran, China, South Korea, Thailand, Peru, Ecuador and Mexico. He was an invited member of the final main jury for the "Virus is Over" design exhibition in Taiwan, 2020. Awards: Honorable mention, 11th Virtual Biennale Prague. Professional category. In 2015 Victor Kovalenko completed his bachelor's degree in Graphic Design at the Moscow Art Industrial Institute in Russia and in 2016 he successfully completed his master's degree in Graphic Design at Middlesex University London with distinction. After his return to Russia in February 2017, he worked as a graphic designer in one of the top educational companies in Moscow. Since April 2019 he has been studying German in Berlin, Germany and in Moscow, Russia. Currently he continues working on different design projects in Russia and international poster exhibitions.





**Pekka Loiri** (1956, Finland) – a member of the International Jury Virtual Biennale Prague . Pekka Loiri has been awarded dozens of international prizes in the graphic design field and has worked as a jury member in dozens of international exhibitions. Loiri has received the government's Design Award, the Award of the Finnish Culture Foundation and the Finnish government art subsidy by the government's Art and Design Committee. He has been voted Graphic Designer of the Year and awarded the Platinum Top by Grafia, (the Graphic Designers Association in Finland), the ProCom Associations Lifetime Achievement Award, the Mexico Poster Biennial medal and the Pro Finlandia medal. Alongside his work as a graphic designer, Loiri has been widely involved in education, working at the University of Art and Design in Helsinki (currently Aalto University) and as the chancellor at the Helsinki MG school. He has worked as a visiting professor and has offered lectures and workshops at a number of universities of art and design all over the world.





**Bartosz Mamak** (1991, Poland) – Professionals: Honourable Mention Wake-Up Call . He is a lecturer of graphic design at Collegium Da Vinci in Poznan, Poland. He creates posters, illustrations, books, fonts and visual identifications. In the year 2018 he was on a six-month scholarship in Hong Kong, during which he interned at the Hong Kong Design Institute. He led lectures and workshops – BiG Poster Zin workshops, Typographic Poster No. 1-2. He is a curator of exhibitions in Poland - BiG Boom! (2017), the Design UAP Gallery, Poznan, BiG Poster Zin #1 (2017), the Rotunda Gallery, Poznan, BiG Poster Zin #2 (2017), and the Pop'n'Art Gallery, Lodz. He co-created the art-design group BiG Poster, which, among other things, focuses on making a poster or publishing a magazine called BiG Poster Zin in workshops. In 2018, he received a scholarship granted by the Ministry of Culture and National Heritage to the best PhD students in Poland. He is the winner of awards in national and international competitions including the Silver Medal at the Shenzhen International Poster Festival, the Bronze Medal at the 8th Virtual Biennale in Prague, the Silver Medal at the International Poster Biennale in Lublin, a distinction at the Taiwan International Graphic Design Award TIGDA and the Golden Bee Global Biennale of Graphic Design in Moscow. He has participated in numerous group exhibitions in Poland, e.g. in Warsaw, Wroclaw, Gdansk, Szczecin, Lublin, as well as abroad, e.g. Ecuador, Greece, China, Scotland, Russia, Macedonia, Spain, Bolivia, the Czech Republic and South Korea.





**Prof. Karel Míšek** (1945, Czech Republic) – a chairman of the Organising Committee and the co-author of the Virtual Biennale Prague). Karel Míšek leads a Graphic Design Studio 1 at the Faculty of Art and Design, Jan Evangelista Purkyně University in Ústí nad Labem. Karel Míšek studied at the Academy of Arts, Architecture and Design in Prague in the studio of prof. František Muzika. He finished this study in 1970. From 1970 to 1973 he studied the Fine Arts at the Warsaw Academy with Prof. Henryk Tomaszewski. In 2013 he was appointed professor at the Academy of Fine Arts in Warsaw by the president of Polish Republic. Has taught many lectures and workshops at home in the Czech Republic and abroad. He has many awards and participation in international panels and has also been appointed as jury for international poster competition. 
